Alicia was born and raised in Johnstown with her mother and father; two sisters and two brothers. They were members of St. Theresa Catholic Church. At age 17, Alicia became pregnant and moved out of her family's home. She worked and finished high school but turned down the opportunity to attend Mount Aloysius College because she wanted to raise her

During a rough time in her life, Alicia was in a serious car accident and had surgery on both of her hips. Unfortunately, she became addicted to her prescribed pain medication and was in and out of jail from May 2011 until December 2015. At that time, she began attending Oakland United Methodist Church (now Oakland Church) and became a member. A few ladies invited her to sign up for the Getting Ahead cohort that the church was hosting. In the class, Alicia learned a lot of resources within the community that

would be of help to her and set some goals. Her immediate goal was to find her own place for herself and her kids and obtain a reliable vehicle. Her five-year plan was to save sufficient money to buy a house with some land and more than one vehicle.

Since graduating from Getting Ahead, Alicia has worked on building her Financial Resources by working some odd jobs and improving her credit score. She has discovered unique ways that have improved her and her son's Emotional Resources, such as yoga and positive music. She endured another hip surgery and a long and painful recovery. Remarkably, she accomplished this without using any prescribed pain medication. She has worked hard on Time Management and has created calendar charts for the whole family.

There are two other resources that were integral pieces to her journey forward. One was her Relational Resources. In other words, gaining the ability to discard relationships that were detrimental to her well-being. To do so takes great emotional strength and courage. Through this, she gained supportive relationships. The other was her Spiritual Resources — involving herself in a supportive church community.

Currently, Alicia has three children; one with special needs. She is homeschooling her two youngest, ages 5 and 7. She has nearly reached her goal of a down payment on a house that she is looking to buy. She has three working vehicles — one for her oldest daughter to use for school. She has no negative marks on her credit, which she has built to a score of nearly 800 from absolutely nothing.

Alicia is continually working to improve herself, having recently become a student of "Give Her Wings Academy." This one-year, online academy educates and prepares students to become effective people-helpers of women who are in domestic violent relationships. After she finishes, she plans to go back to school to become a certified counselor for women and children that have been abused or have been in a family that were addicted to drugs.

Congratulations, Alicia, on all that you have accomplished! We wish you blessings as you pursue an amazing future.




